As chairpersons of the organizing committee, I on my own behalf and on behalf of the organizing committee, extend you a cordial invitation to attend the conference. The Postgraduate Department of Plastic Surgery, Lucknow Plastic Surgery Club and the U.P. Cudos to all of you for academic and clinical activities. Celebrations of National Plastic Surgery Day on 15th July were overwhelming. When you are gearing up for APSICON 2012, let me once again remind you the New Scheme of Election:-

- i) Two Election Officers shall be appointed by the President for supervision of election process.
- ii) Nominations duly proposed and seconded by members can be submitted on the day of Charles Pinto CME and day one i.e. 5th and 6th November, 2012 till noon 1200 hours to Hon. Treasurer Dr. Shailesh Ranade. Application forms for the same are available with the Secretary and the Treasurer.
- iii) Scrutiny of nominations shall be done on 6th November between 12 -1 pm.
- iv) The list shall be displayed on the notice board on 6th November by 1pm.
- v) Withdrawal shall be permitted till 12 noon on 7th November (day 2 of the conference).
- vi) The final list of contestants will be put on 7th November by 1pm.
- vi) Ballot paper shall be distributed and submitted between 2 5 p.m. on 7th November. vii) Counting shall be 5 p.m. onwards on 7th November. Once the counting has started no ballot papers shall be issued. Two member nominated by the President with the help of the secretary and treasurer of APSI shall scrutinize the list of delegates for their good standing. The result shall be declared at appropriate time during the general body meeting, on 7th November. Members are requested to take note of this scheme and make it convenient to visit the election polling booth at specified time to be able to cast their vote.

APSICON 2012

The 47th Annual Conference of The Association of Plastic Surgeons of India is being held in India's most cultural city Lucknow from 6th till 8th November, 2012. On Sunday 4th November Prof. CR Sunderrajan Memorial Live Surgery Workshop will be held. APSI Ethicon Accredited Course on Cleft Surgery will precede the workshop on 2nd and 3rd November. On 5th November Dr. Charles Pinto Memorial CME and later the main conference will be held at newly inaugurated Centenary Conference Auditorium. Visit www.apsicon2012.com for details.

15th IPRAS 2009 Humanitarian Activities Fund

- 1. The fund will be governed by general rules applicable to all corpuses managed by APSI, i.e. the usual rules of APSI Trust will apply in disbursing the interest and augmenting the corpus on an annual basis.
- If there is no proposal in a financial year the entire interest generated will be used to augment the corpus.
- 3. It will be specifically used for organizing humanitarian activities on behalf of APSI, like organizing 'Surgical Camps' at remote places with the help of local charitable groups or medical colleges, where Plastic Surgery facilities don't exist.
- 4. The first such disbursement will be in the year 2013.
- 5. The proposals will be submitted to Secretary, APSI at least 8 months before the camp activity.
- 6. All proposals should include the complete plan, the co-hosts (and their role), financial details, list of surgeons and other staff, food and stay arrangements, venue of surgery etc. Proposals should be comprehensive in all aspects.
- 7. The Committee to consider such proposals will consist of the President and Secretary of APSI; President, Chairman and Secretary General of IPRAS-2009, and Dr. Chanjiv Singh (Chairman-Humanitarian Committee-IPRAS). This group (Secretary APSI) will present the proposal to the APSI Executive and an electronic approval of the APSI Executive will be taken by him/her to expedite the decision.
- 8. Surgeons from overseas will need MCI and / or State Medical Council Registration as per rule applicable at the time. This will be ensured by the organizers.
- 9. A separate bank account will be opened for this purpose by the Chief Organizer and it will have a minimum of two signatories, who will be authorized by APSI Executive to operate this account jointly,
- 10. This is a financial support of the nature of one time lump sum grant
- 11. APSI or IPRAS or IPRAS 2009 Organizing committee will take no responsibility in the conduct of the camp. APSI is only a disbursing agency in this regard. The Chief Organizer will furnish a signed statement absolving the above agencies from all risks and liabilities clinical social and legal in the conduct of the camp.
- 12. APSI or IPRAS or IPRAS 2009 Organizing committee will not accept or entertain any demands if there are shortfalls of any manner in the conduct of the camp.
- 13. The surgical camp will not be conducted in a personal nursing home of a member of APSI. However, it may be carried out in a nursing home where Plastic Surgery facilities don't exist in the Region.
- 14. Chief Organizer of the camp is to furnish a full audited statement of accounts within 2 months of the conclusion of the activity. If there are any savings from the amount disbursed they will be returned along with the audited statement.
- 15. The Chief Organizer will also be responsible to furnish a report of the camp which includes the proceedings, number of cases operated (their detailed list) and some pictures of activity as well as clinical results.
- 16. All branding for the Camp will bear IPRAS, IPRAS 2009 and APSI Logo. Branding will also have the words inscribed, 'Supported by Association of Plastic Surgeons of India'.
- 17. No personal promotion by way of pictures or names etc will be permissible.
- 18. Any misconduct during the 'Camp' which brought to the notice of APSI Executive will invite disciplinary proceedings according to 'Rules & Regulations' governing APSI.
- 19. The Chief Organizer requesting APSI funds will sign the 'Rules' mentioned above from serial 3-18 on a Rs. 100 non judicial stamp paper, as a token of acceptance, and get it notarized.

Change in the Name of the Association

(Notice as per the bye laws)

Based on the inputs from several senior members, overseas colleagues, Hon. Health Minister and Health Secretary as well as following the Example of British Association there is a need now to enhance the sphere of the association which should be apparent in the name itself.

After deliberations the Executive Council has reached a consensus to suggest the name "Association of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons of India". Also Association may write to the MCI to change the nomenclature of the degree of MCh or DNB as (Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery)

This point will be discussed in General Body meeting to be held at Lucknow and resolution will be passed accordingly. Notice is being given to members as per the bye laws.

(Notice as per the bye laws) Proposed Terms of Agreement between IPRAS-APS and APSI For initiating Asia Pacific Journal of Plastic, Reconstructive & Aesthetic Surgery (AP-JPRAS)

On a request from the Secretary General of the International Confederation of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery it has been decided by Journal negotiating committee of APSI comprising of President (Prof A.K. Singh), President Elect (Dr Ashok Gupta), Dr Mukund Thatte (Past Editor, IJPS), Dr Raja Sabapathy (Past Editor, IJPS), Dr Surajit Bhattacharya (Editor, IJPS) and Dr Atul Shah (Secretary, APSI) to propose the following terms of Agreement to rechristen the **Indian Journal of Plastic Surgery** as the 'Asia Pacific Journal of Plastic, Reconstructive & Aesthetic Surgery (AP-JPRAS)'. Whereas this change will provide the Asia Pacific Section of IPRAS a valuable academic compendium it will catapult The Indian Journal of Plastic Surgery in to International horizon by becoming a torch bearer of a very important regional Plastic Surgery Society.

Following a meeting of the committee members with the Secretary General of IPRAS-APS on 1st July 2012 at Lucknow, which Dr Atul Shah and Dr Raja Sabapathy couldn't attend, it was agreed unanimously to accept the proposal and further decided to propose the following terms to frame an agreement between IPRAS-APS and APSI.

- 1. The copyright and ownership of the Journal (including historical archival content) will rest with Association of Plastic Surgeons of India without any further discussion or legal recourse.
- 2. The cover page of the Journal will reflect joint representation of the two Societies by mentioning- An official organ of Association of Plastic Surgeons of India and International Confederation of Plastic, Reconstructive & Aesthetic Surgery-Asia Pacific Section'.
- 3. The journal will continue to be in English language.
- 4. The Volume number of the journal will continue seamlessly.
- 5. The number of issues each year will be decided by the Editor and the publishers.
- 6. A financial arrangement of the journal will be worked out jointly with the publishers.
- 7. The Editor of the rechristened Journal will be selected through open advertisement by the publishers and through the websites of the Societies.
- 8. The Editor will be chosen for a period of 5 years by a collegiums comprising of the President APSI, Executive Trustee of APSI, Secretary General IPRAS-APS, A nominee of General Body of APSI, a nominee of Secretary General of IPRAS-APS and a representative of the Publishers. It was decided that Dr Mukund Thatte will represent the Executive Trustee of APSI on the collegiums as long as Dr Rajeev Ahuja remains the Secretary General of IPRAS-APS.
- 9. The new Editor of AP-JPRAS will only take over after the 2^{nd} term of the current Editor of IJPS is completed.
- 10. The current Editor of IJPS will continue to hold office even after his 2nd term is over if the new Editor appointment is delayed for any reason, and thereafter, he would hand over the charge to the incoming Editor.
- 11. It is desired that the Editor will be paid a suitable honorarium in consultation with the publishers.

- 12. The Editor will report, biannually, to the Executive of APSI and Secretary General of IPRAS-APS.
- 13. The Editor will maintain the highest ethical and moral standards as well as scientific excellence of the journal.
- 14. Two deputy Editors will be appointed by the same collegiums and they will continue to hold office for 5 years. One of the Deputy Editors will be a member of APSI.
- 15. Deputy Editors will also be paid a proportionate honorarium.
- 16. Deputy Editors will report to the Editor and will be assigned responsibilities directly by the Editor.
- 17. The Editorial Board will be jointly constituted by the same Collegiums minus the publisher's representative, but will also include the Editor.
- 18. The appointing collegiums will ensure a broad geographic and sub-specialty representation of the Editorial Board.
- 19. There is no upper limit to the number of persons on the Editorial Board.
- 20. Each member of the Editorial Board will be responsible for reviewing at least 9 manuscripts annually.
- 21. No member of the Editorial Board will be entitled to any remuneration or compensation of any sort.
- 22. The Editor may appoint 'Reviewers' of his choice over and above the members of the Editorial Board.
- 23. All 'Reviewers' of manuscripts will be acknowledged in the last issue of the year.
- 24. The Editorial Board will meet once a year to review the progress of the Journal. This meeting will be with the Annual APSI meeting for 3 years in a quadrennial, but in the year of the IPRAS-APS Congress it will take place in the country of the Congress. The meeting expenses like venue and refreshments will be paid by the publishers but the participation cost of the Board members will be borne by individuals themselves.
- 25. As APSI membership includes the subscription to the Journal it will continue to be provided (in hard copy as well as free online access) to all APSI Members.
- 26. As IPRAS-APS membership doesn't include the cost of the Journal subscription it will be provided to all other members of IPRAS-APS up on payment of a subsidized subscription (to general selling price) directly to the publisher (individually or collectively through the National Society).
- 27. Only member countries of IPRAS-APS will be eligible for these benefits.
- 28. All financial dealings, including collection of advertisements will be the sole responsibility of the publishers, who will annually submit a balance sheet to APSI and IPRAS-APS.
- 29. APSI will pay a Journal subscription fee to the publishers depending on the number of copies requested each year.
- 30. Profit sharing between the publishers and the Societies (APSI and IPRAS-APS) will be on mutual agreement and guided by such arrangements in operation internationally.
- 31. Profit share between the two Societies will be 60% for APSI and 40% for IPRAS-APS.

- 32. However, legal cost of any dispute between the Societies and publishers will be borne by APSI as it will continue to own the Journal. Legal jurisdiction to settle disputes will be in India.
- 33. The current publishers (Wolters Kluwer India) may be retained in the new arrangement by drawing out a new MOU to be signed by President APSI and Secretary General IPRAS-APS. This MOU will have five year validity.
- 34. The Societies will be free to negotiate with another publisher should the terms offered by the current publisher are not acceptable. These negotiations will be held on behalf of the Societies by the Editorial Collegiums constituted as above.

From The ORGANISING CHAIRMAN – APSICON 2011 SUGGESTIONS FOR USE of the SURPLUS FUNDS ARISING FROM APSICON 2011

Dr. S. Raja Sabapathy, our immediate Past President and Organizing Chairman of APSICON 2011 gave a power point presentation on the above topic during the Executive Committee Meeting held at Mumbai on 25th March 2012. The summary of the talk is reproduced below:

Dear Mr. President and Members of the Executive Committee

At the outset I thank all the members of APSICON 2011 for their participation which made APSICON 2011 a great success. We had a total registration of 749 persons, which included 124 trainees. The meeting was preceded by APSI 2005 - Ethicon sponsored course in Hand Surgery. It had 166 registrations but the participants were close to 350 members. The first 40 trainee registration fees were refunded. The meeting had 18 overseas faculties and had representation of surgeons from 22 countries. Over all it was a great success.

Apart from being an academic and social success, financially also it was a very successful meeting. I am happy to inform you that we have come out with a surplus of Rs. 55,61,396. 88 a record so far. In continuing the healthy tradition, I have submitted an audited statement of accounts of the congress to every member of the Executive Committee and all the accounts in the banks corresponding to APSICON 2011 have been closed and the entire amount is now being handed over to the President, Secretary and Trustees of the Association during the Executive Committee Meeting.

Suggestion and Thought Process for Usage of the Funds "Riches are for spending" - Francis Bacon

As the quote of Francis Bacon goes, power of money that we create rests in the way we use it. The responsibility seems to be greater in magnitude, than the efforts that were required to collect it. Conventionally the surplus funds are utilized to create endowments, traveling fellowships, awards or orations to be delivered during APSICON.

As of now our trustees are managing 43 named corpuses. Many visiting professorships and traveling fellowship go un-utilized. There are no time slots available for new orations in APSICON. In view of this we feel that it would be futile to create any new corpus to mark the surplus as the Coimbatore or the APSICON 2011 fund.

We feel that the need of the hour is to help the specialty grow and its members to provide high quality care to the patients and improving patient outcomes. Taking all these into consideration, the organizing committee members of the APSICON 2011 propose the following. The model has been derived by analyzing the way funds are managed in American, British and other organizations.

We propose the setup of an "APSI Educational Foundation" to help the members of the APSI

- To provide the highest standards of care as accepted by peers around the world.
- To ensure its availability to everyone who needs it at the time they need it and
- To create leaders who will take the specialty into the future at a global level.

We propose that a group of members should be inducted to the Committee which will manage and direct its efforts. Many long standing overseas associations have such committees to look into such matters very actively. It should be like the "Think Tank" of the Association and its members could be the academic thought leaders of the specialty. The foundation will realize its function by:

- Help to improve the standards of clinical practice of Plastic Surgery in India through skill development programs.
- To be involved in the promotion of the specialty by increasing the awareness of plastic surgery among the public.
- Improve the outcomes of plastic surgery patients through research and development.
- Also to be a philanthropic arm of the APSI wherein we facilitate the availability of the services of the members to the needy and to the masses at times of crises both at national and international level.
- In this way it is possible that we will be able to make an impact in the global level and help India to lead the world.

What will the Composition of the Foundation?

The foundation will be led by the Chairman chosen by the Executive Committee. The Managing Trustee of the APSI Trust and the President of the APSI will be ex-officio members. The Committee will have a further 5 persons representing different sub specialties. The duration of the Committee could be 5 years.

Responsibility of the Committee

The members of the Committee must be willing to devote time and energy for the cause. Will be willing to lead, chair, collect and augment the funds of the endowment. This will not clash with the running of the annual APSICON and also not be influenced by the electoral changes in the Association. Members should be of proven academic standing with good accountability. Accountability, transparency and relentless efforts to reach the goals set will be the work mode of the members. It is preferable that the members to be selected by the Executive Committee and not by election.

What will be its standing?

The Committee will work under the umbrella of the Executive Committee and Trustees and they in turn will communicate to the General body of the recommendations. APSI Educational Foundation will not have any special registration. The trustees will manage the funds and the members of the Foundation will not have any role in the choice and mode of investment of the funds. The team will only give the directions to deploy funds to achieve the purposes in the vision statement.

We request the acceptance of this proposal for the creation of APSI Educational Foundation. There is no need to add any tags of Coimbatore or APSICON 2011. We presume that in future this will get contributions from future congresses and we could think of major initiatives to enhance the growth of the specialty. It is aimed that it will help to introduce best practices amongst the members and will be an effective arm for promoting the specialty among the public. In course of time, this would also be involved in evolving the system of examinations. This may set a trend for super specialty examinations.

We moot this idea because we need to efficiently use the surplus we make every year. We must make

every rupee count and every rupee work.
