

Rules and Guidelines

Technical Details for short films:

- The video should be in MP4 or MOV format with frame rate of 25 fps (PAL).
- The recommended resolution should be $-1920 \times 1080 \text{ FHD}$.
- The preferred film orientation is Horizontal or Landscape view (aspect ratio 16:9 widescreen).
- Any archival footage used can be of a different resolution but should be placed in a seamless fashion. The film should not have jerks, black frames, glitches, frame drops, etc.
- The used footage should be solely owned by the filmmaker with copyright permissions for any sourced clips from other authors.
- Music and background score should be legally acquired by the filmmaker for usage.
- The shortlisted and awarded films will be used by the Exec. council of APSI for visual communication and general awareness purposes.
- The video and audio should be of high quality.
- The running time of the short film should be between 3-7 minutes. However, if a film has exceptional quality message, the time limit can be relaxed on a case-to-case basis.
- The film should contain a title and <u>APSI Logo</u> at the beginning, the category to which it belongs, and in the end a message to the public.

All the entries should abide by the guidelines of the Indian Copyright Act 1957

The Copyright Act of 1957, protects original literary, dramatic, musical, and artistic works and cinematograph films and sound recordings from unauthorized uses. Unlike the case with patents, copyright protects the expressions and not the ideas. There is no copyright in idea.

• The film or documentary should showcase an idea or case representing an aspect of plastic surgery from a common man's viewpoint without too much technicality.

Awards

- APSI will have all the rights to showcase / display / play a video or part of the video on any platform at any date. The copyright and ownership of all the submitted movies will remain with the participant but APSI will be authorised to use the movie for advocacy as and when required.
- The Auditory/ narration medium of the film should be Hindi, English, or other Indian language. In case of a language other than English, the video should include subtitles in English as well.
- Due consent for the film should be taken from patients as per the international ethical consensus.
- There should be no negative remarks about a person or an organization in the video. Discrimination of any type, regardless of gender, ethnicity, or religion, is strictly forbidden.
- Promotion of any commercial product, substance or potentially hazardous materials are forbidden in the film.
- The film must be submitted latest by **June 15**, **2022**, for consideration in the competition.
- In case of any disputes the decision of APSI will be final



THE GOLDEN TEMPLE

The Golden Temple (also known as the Harmandir Sahib) is a gurdwara located in the city of Amritsar, Punjab, India. It is the preeminent spiritual site of Sikhism.

The gurdwara is built around a man-made pool (sarovar) that was completed by the fourth Sikh Guru, Guru Ram Das, in 1577. In 1604, Guru Arjan placed a copy of the Adi Granth in Harmandir Sahib. The Gurdwara was repeatedly rebuilt by the Sikhs after it became a target of persecution and was destroyed several times by the Mughal and invading Afghan armies. Maharaja Ranjit Singh, after founding the Sikh Empire, rebuilt it in marble and copper in 1809 and overlaid the sanctum with Gold foil in 1830. This has led to the name the Golden Temple.

JALLIANWALA BAGH

Jallianwala Bagh is a historic garden and 'memorial of national importance' close to the Golden Temple complex in Amritsar, Punjab, India, preserved in the memory of those wounded and killed in the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre that occurred on the site on the festival of Baisakhi, 13 April 1919. The 7-acre site houses a museum, gallery and several memorial structures. It is managed by the Jallianwala Bagh National Memorial Trust. It was renovated between 2019 and 2021.





PARTITION MUSEUM

The Partition Museum is a public museum located in the town hall in Amritsar, India. The museum aims to become the central repository of stories, materials, and documents related to the post-partition riots that followed the division of British India into two independent countries: India and Pakistan. The museum was inaugurated on 25 August 2017.

In 1947, British India was divided into India and Pakistan. The partition lines, drawn on a map by the British lawyer Cyril Radcliffe, divided the states of Punjab into West Punjab and East Punjab on the basis of religion. As a result, millions of people found themselves on the wrong side of the border overnight.

WAGAH BORDER

The lowering of the flags ceremony at the Attari-Wagah border is a daily military practice that the security forces of India (Border Security Force, BSF) and Pakistan (Pakistan Rangers) have jointly followed since 1959. The drill is characterized by elaborate and rapid dance-like manoeuvres and raising legs as high as possible, which have been described as "colourful". It is alternatively a symbol of the two countries' rivalry, as well as brotherhood and cooperation between the two nations.



At the international border between India and Pakistan, the pomp and pageantry of the Beating Retreat and the Change of Guard occur within the handshaking distance of the Indian and Pakistani forces. Wagah, an army outpost on the India-Pakistan border between Amritsar and Lahore, is an elaborate complex of buildings, roads and barriers on both sides.



GOBINDGARH FORT

Gobindgarh Fort is a historic military fort located in the center of the city of Amritsar in the Indian state of Punjab. The Fort was until recently occupied by the army but was opened to the public from 10 February 2017. Today the fort is being developed as a museum and theme park, as a repository of Punjab's history. Popularly known as the Bhangian da Killa (fort of the Bhangis) after its 18th century founder belonging to Bhangi Misl of Dhillon Jats rulers. Sandhawalia Jat ruler Maharaja Ranjit Singh renamed it in the early 19th century after the 10th Sikh guru, Guru Gobind Singh.

Depending on planning of Scientific Sessions at APSICON 2022, such papers may or may not be grouped for presentation simultaneously. Panel of Judges will choose winner from presentations.

International Visiting Scholar Programme APSICON 2012. Two (2)

Guidelines - International Visiting Scholar Programme APSICON 2012

Introduction

- The Association of Plastic Surgeons of India (APSI) awards Two International Scholarships per Calendar year to a suitable overseas candidate for visiting Plastic Surgery centers in India to enhance his/her professional and academic career.
- The Fellowship was established in the year 2014 through a generous grant from the proceeds of APSICON2012, the 46th Annual meeting of the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India held at Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh, India in the year 2012.
- The Fellowship provides financial support to the tune of Indian Rs. 1,50,000 (One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Only) which is inclusive of the Early Bird Registration for the Annual Meeting of the APSI (APSICON) usually held towards last quarter of calendar year. It will be paid in Indian Rupees to the candidate or to any one of the host institute to be passed on to the scholar.
- The award amount is fixed and is intended to cover the travel costs and stay in the host institute. It can be used to cover costs for visa, passports, airport taxes etc. The award does not cover medical care, insurances or taxes in the country of the scholar; none of which the APSI will be liable for. They also should not be used to provide support for accompanying dependents.
- The Fellowship is not granted for basic training, courses, lectures, meetings, conferences, congresses, etc. It cannot be granted to candidates who are already physically present at the proposed host
- institute whilst their applications are under consideration.
- The period of fellowship in general will be for 3 months, which can be extended by the Fellow with mutual consent of the host institute for a period not more than another three months. The fellowship amount granted by the APSI will remain the same.
- The original Fellowship cannot be prolonged, or run concurrently with other awards, even those funded by other agencies. These Fellowships may not be financially supplemented by agencies other than the home or host institutes, or the Fellows personally.
- The candidate may choose to visit any center of his/ her choice subject to approval from the Executive Committee of the APSI. In case the candidate is unable to find a placement, the association may assist him in the matter.
- The candidate shall be responsible for communicating directly with the centers that he or she wishes to visit and obtaining their approval, which then has to be communicated to the APSI before the application can be considered for approval.
- The candidate shall be responsible for making his or her own travel and lodging arrangements and visa formalities.
- If an individual is selected as an International Scholar and is unable to obtain a visa, APSI is not responsible for continuation of the offer beyond a reasonable date, in which case the offer shall be extended to next candidate in waiting.
- The APSI shall ask the host institute to furnish a letter of acceptance to the fellowship program should the candidate require such a documentation for visa purposes.
- The candidate has to plan his or her itinerary such that he or she should be able to attend the Annual Conference of the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India (APSICON), which is usually held in the last quarter of the calendar year.
- The fellowship certificate shall be awarded to the candidate at this Annual Conference of the APSI.
- The fellowship award is inclusive of the Early Bird Registration fee of the candidate for attending the Annual Conference of the APSI
- following which the candidate shall be eligible to apply for the Overseas Membership of the APSI at prevailing rates.
- Majority funds shall be sent to the candidate or the host institute by APSI on receiving intimation of arrival of the scholar. The remaining remuneration if any shall be awarded to the candidate upon completion of the fellowship.

- The completion report along with a daily log of activity at the centers visited shall be submitted compulsorily to Secretary APSI, before the award can be completed. The completion report should include details regarding the candidates' experience in India, what objectives were achieved and how the experience will affect their career goals.
- The candidates should, in their report, evaluate the program and the centers they visited and offer suggestions for modification and improvement.
- The report should be submitted preferably at the completion of the Fellowship related to visit of each of the centers.

Eligibility

- The candidate has to be a Plastic Surgeon/Surgeon practicing plastic surgery in his/her native country in the early stages of his/her plastic surgical career.
- Candidates who have passed the eligibility exam of their respective country within ten years of the date of application shall be preferred.
- Candidate should be residing outside India. Candidate has to be a surgeon of good standing among his peers as attested by the recommendations required by the application process.
- Each applicant should submit a short project summary of the objective of the visit, the reasons for selecting the host supervisor and the way the experience will be utilized after return from India.
- Hence, preference will be given to candidates who have shown adequate inclination to the sub-specialty they have chosen as well as their future prospects of utilization of the training obtained.
- The candidate has to be in good health and not suffering from any communicable diseases and has to furnish sufficient documentation to the effect.
- Candidate should be able to communicate in English language.
- The APSI or the host centers shall in no way be responsible for any health or safety issues that may arise during the course of the fellowship. The candidate should be suitably insured for the same.

Application process

- The application process has to be completed and submitted to the APSI Secretary usually before 30th July of each year (30th July, 2018 for the fellowship commencing in the year 2019) for the fellowship program that begins the next year.
- The application has to be on the prescribed format downloadable from the Association's (APSI) website (www.apsi.in)
- The application has to be bolstered by the necessary documents as mentioned in the concerned section.
- The application has to be submitted electronically to the Secretary of the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India (APSI) at email address specified in the form, and the same to be copied to singhkarun@ hotmail.com
- The candidate may re-apply for a maximum of three years in continuity.

Documentation

- Application completed in all respects along with one recent frontal photograph and documents as demanded in application.
- Two recommendation one from the Head / Director / Dean of the Department from where the candidate has passed the eligibility exam and another from the Secretary, President or any office bearer of the National Organization of the candidates specialty. In case there is no association then he may send the recommendation letter or from the association of his basic speciality.

APSI - Dr S Raja Sabapathy Leadership award (supported by Dr. Somes Guha)

The APSI – DrS Raja Sabapathy Leadership Award (supported by Dr Somes Guha), was instituted by Dr Somes Guha, a Plastic Surgeon of Indian Origin presently settled in the US. A corpus of Rs 15,00,000 has been deposited by him with the APSI to present one award each year. The award will be of the value of Rs 1,00,000 with a medal.

The Goal of the Award:

The intention of Dr Somes Guha in instituting this award is to provide a member of the APSI to develop leadership skills to help develop institutions, nurture academic bodies, innovations to reach out to the masses or to enhance the quality of care, thus improving the status of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in the country. The award is to be used by the awardees preferentially to develop the non-surgical skills which are so essential to leave behind a legacy. It could be used to take leadership and management courses, spending time with mentors to realise specific goals or any such activity which would benefit the field of Plastic Surgery and the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India. It is expected that the awardees will in future rise up to take leadership positions in the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India.

Criteria for Selection

- The applicant must be a member of the APSI, and within 25 years from qualification. While there is no lower or upper age limit, it is expected for the awardee to be in a position to utilise the award to the stated goals of the award.
- The applicant must send a copy of the CV, with a letter limited to 500 words providing justification of the award and as to how he/she will utilize the award. Goals with timelines will be appreciated and this letter will form one of the important criteria of selection.
- The applicant will provide the name of two referees who will vouch for the candidates selection.
- Selection will be made by a committee consisting of the President, President-Elect, Immediate Past President of APSI, one co opted member of the EC and Dr S Raja Sabapathy
- The award becomes operational in 2019. The EC decided that the committee will select the first candidate and from then on applications will be called for the selection for the award in future years.
- Applications are called for the selection for 2022 and the last date for receiving the application is 31st August 2022 by the secretary on hsecapsi@gmail.com or kuhuvidush@hotmail.com. The winner will be announced during the APSICON 2022 The awardee must complete the assignment before Aug, 2023 and submit a report to the Secretary of the APSI, who in turn will forward it to the EC and the members of the selection committee for approval.
- The award money and the medal will be given to the candidate during the APSICON 2022.

Background Information

Dr Somes Guha is a Plastic Surgeon of Indian Origin, who worked for the major part of his life in the United Kingdom and USA and presently settled in the United States. He is passionate about Indian History and the history of Sushruta in particular. He donated a fund of over US \$ 100,000 to the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh to establish the Sushruta – Guha oration. A committee of the British Association of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgeons chose a surgeon with international reputation to deliver the oration during the summer meeting of the BAPRAS. Established in the year 2012, Dr S Raja Sabapathy delivered the 5th oration in 2016 at the meeting of the BAPRAS in Bristol. From 2018, the oration has been moved by the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh to be delivered during the ICOPLAST meeting. Dr Guha wished to establish an award for developing the leadership skills in Plastic Surgeons which he felt would be of immense benefit for the growth of Plastic Surgery in India.





5) NOTICE FROM GST Council Mumbai

A notice was received by APSI from GST Department, Mumbai on 23.7.2021 in reference to the return GST ASMT 10 for the tax period 07 2017 - 03 2018. The notice intimated APSI that GST return filed for FY 2017-18 had a difference in liability shown in GSTR 1 and GSTR 3B along with GSTR 2A and required APSI to pay the outstanding tax amounting to Rs. 7,38,013/-. The matter was discussed with the APSI auditor and was inferred that the dues were pertaining to the APSICON 2017. The matter was also discussed with members of Board of

Trustees, APSI auditor, auditor of APSOCON 2017 and Dr. Subramanium Iyer, Past President APSI (Organizing Chairman APSICON 2017) and auditor of APSICON 2017 was requested to provide the books of account or Tally data of the conference. On receipt of the books of accounts, the data of APSICON 2017 was reconciled with returns filed in FY 2017-18 and the outstanding tax amount of Rs. 3,39,804/- was deposited with GST department. APSI auditor has represented to the department for commuting of the interest amount in its reply. In addition to this the APSI auditor has informed that APSI needs to be prepared for further notices from the department for the Financial Year 2017-18 (ongoing) and Financial Year 2018-19 as well, as there is a GST tax liability of around Rs. 8.5Lakhs excluding interest and penalty. Hence the Tally data for the Financial Year 2018-19 is also required for analysis of exact tax liability

In view of this following resolutions were passed in the last EXCO meeting:

"The complete Tally data of the books of accounts of APSICON 2017, APSICON 2018 and APSICON 2019 may be made available to Treasurer APSI for the purpose of reconciliation of books of accounts with GST returns.

The Treasurer thanked the august body, the Executive Committee Members and the members of the Board of Trust for their support and contribution.

Prof.(Dr.) Sameek Bhattacharya Treasurer APSI

Treasurer's Report was passed unanimously by all the members present in the General Body meeting.

Accounts- Year Ending 31st March 2021

Trustee's report for the year 2019-21. Dr. Ahuja presented the final audited accounts of the Trust as of 31st March 2021.Dr Ahuja complimented treasurer for exemplary work and said I am voluntarily resigning as an executive trustee. These audited accounts had been earlier submitted to the Treasurer APSI for amalgamation with the other accounts of the Association. It was stated that these accounts will be submitted to the authorities before the due date, which now stands extended till the 31st December 2021.

Dr Ahuja highlighted that these final accounts reflected that the Corpus now was about 8.214 Crores. Presenting the Income / Expenditure statement Dr Ahuja stated that there was approximately Rs 40 lakh of excess income over the expenditure in the last financial year due to curtailed activities of the Association from COVID 19 restrictions. It was advised by the CA of the Trust that the CA of the APSI who files the income tax returns should now write a request letter to the income tax authorities requesting a carry forward of the excess income by stating the obvious reasons or else we will be liable to pay a heavy tax on these savings. The balance sheet also reflected the Rs 10 lakh loan extended to APSICON 2020 being held in 2021. This amount was due for return in the current financial year.

15% of all interest generated was used to augment each corpus as reflected on the relevant pages of the balance sheet statement. Total income during the year was approximately Rs 51.68 lakhs and the expenditure was approximately Rs 11.75 lakhs. Rs 3,92,217/- was the final savings from APSICON 2018 of which Rs 92,217/- was received in the year 2020-21. As is mandated by previous Resolutions 10% of above was used to augment the Journal Corpus and 5% to the Buffer fund. The remaining was added to the corpus of R N Sharma Symposium Corpus as per desire of the APSICON 2018 organizers.

Treasurer's budget for 2021-22 showed an estimated expenditure of Rs 38.67 Lakhs.

Treasurer had already been provided Rs 9.5 lakhs and he would be receiving Rs 10 lakhs from the APSICON 2021 which was the return of the loan.

Reorganization of the APSICOPN 2011 corpus and the IPRAS 2009 Humanitarian Fund corpus was executed as was Resolved in an earlier Executive meeting. Thus, Rs 40 lakhs was transferred from APSICON 2011 corpus to the Journal corpus which now was around 1.2989 crores. The remaining amount of Rs 22, 99, 329/- was converted in to a new corpus of 'Virtual Office of APSI'. The entire amount of IPRAS 2009 Humanitarian Fund Corpus of Rs 32, 94, 710/- was transferred to the APSI accredited Course corpus which now stood at Rs 42, 81, 627/-. Dr. Ahuja explained that with this augmentation the APSI accredited courses could easily fund itself by interest as the courses were now held virtually, and if six courses are held in a year at an average cost of Rs 30,000/- per course the entire expense could be easily met.

The change report in respect of the appointment of Dr Ramesh Sharma, the demise of Dr. Suresh Gupta and the appointment of Dr V. Bhattacharya as the Chairman of the Trust will be filed shortly as the papers are almost complete. With in a week the documents should reach Dr Thatte for handing over to Dr Shailesh Ranade who is overseeing this submission. The Change report in respect of the change in the Bye laws is still under preparation at the lawyer's office in Mumbai.

Dr Shailesh Ranade was asked by the Treasurer about his desire to have the Registered office moved from his residence but there was no response. The Registered office of APSI continues to be the same.

The two accounts, one in Canara Bank and the other in the Central Bank could not be closed as we were struggling with the main account in SBI at Mumbai. The request to Change the branch to Delhi was not getting executed nor was Dr Ahuja's phone number getting incorporated for online checking of accounts (online transactions are banned on our Trust account). Also interest from an HDFC deposit was to get credited in the Canara Bank account on the 31st March 2021. This work can be executed in the current financial year.

There was no further development regarding the court cases pertaining to Dr Ashok Gupta as the courts have been closed due to COVID.

Dr. Ahuja explained the notice from the income tax department regarding our GST liabilities for 2017-18. Notice was received from GST Dept, Mumbai on 23.7.2021 reference GST return for the tax period 07/2017 – 03/2018.

The notice intimated APSI that GST return filed for FY 2017-18 had a difference in liability and required APSI to pay the outstanding tax amounting to Rs. 7,38,013/-.

The dues were pertaining to the APSICON 2017.

APSICON 2017 was requested for Tally data. An outstanding tax amount of Rs. 3,39,804/- was deposited with GST department. APSI has represented to the department for commuting of the interest amount. This amount will be deducted from the APSICON 2011 corpus. Thus the following Resolution was adopted.

The amount paid to income tax department in respect of the GST liability from the APSICON 2017 / 2018/2019 accounts shall be deducted from the respective corpus.

APSI auditor has informed that APSI needs to be prepared for further notices from the department for the Financial Year 2017-18 (ongoing) and Financial Year 2018-19 as well, as there is a GST tax liability of around Rs. 8.5 Lakhs, excluding interest and penalty.

Hence the Tally data for the Financial Year 2018-19 is also required for analysis of exact tax liability.

The Executive Trustee underscored that since APSICON is organized with APSI PAN No. it should be customary to share the Tally data of Conference accounts regularly in order to determine exact tax liability and that GST returns are filled properly.

Following Resolutions passed by EC on 23rd Sept 2021 Meeting were shared.

'The complete Tally data of the books of accounts of APSICON 2017, APSICON 2018 and APSICON 2019 may be made available to Treasurer APSI for the purpose of reconciliation of books of accounts with GST returns.'

'Now on Tally data of books of accounts of APSICON will be shared every 3 months with the Treasurer APSI for the purpose of GST filling'.

Court cases

Court case filed in charity commissioner office has been closed in our favour

Dr Ahuja informed a complaint was launched in the same office for which he was summoned last November 2020 and he attended that along with Dr Mukund Thatee, a 2000 Page documents were provided to them in justification, that this case was frivolous and this should be scratched. We have not yet it's almost a year now. And we have not yet heard back from the office of the charity Commissioner, the fate of this court case, and then is the court case which was initially filed the civil suit against Apsi. And the courts have not been functioning for last one and a half years. So nothing has been decided, but on the basis of the judgement which has been received from the charity

Commissioner office, the same judgement will be shown whenever there is a next hearing in the civil suit, and we are likely to win that case also. That is, we are very optimistic about it.

A fourth case has been filed very disturbingly against individuals as a criminal offence for having denied Dr. Gupta his Gillies oration and and for this wrongful termination, this criminal court case is personally in the names of Rajiv Ahuja, Prabha Yadav. Mukund Thatte, Dr. Ramesh Sharma, Shailesh Ranade and two chartered accountants that these have manipulated and these are were in connivance to execute this to turn him out and to deny him the Gilies oration. This was absolutely false. All actually were summoned with a non bailable warrant, and which was again very unjust on part of the presiding judge. We all had to go to Bombay to seek bail. We are all on bail at the moment. And to top it all, there was no investigation to find this criminal case. The investigating officer did not even talk to us to take our opinion and the judge permitted to admit the case and issue a non bailable warrant to us. We have filed for quashing of this criminal case. And unfortunately, this was put on a stay order was given for the execution of the order of the Metropolitan Magistrate. But we have filed a case for quashing of the case. These this case but there has been no hearing for one and a half years. So we have not been able to move any further on this matter also. Although we have decided now that we will through our lawyers approach the court and tell them for an early resolution of this stay order and to portion of the case next. So before I take your leave, I am very happy to announce that although I have stepped down the association, the trust will be very able hands of Dr. Mukund Thatee who has been appointed as the new executive trustee, and from next general body onwards he will be he'll be the one who will be participating as an executive trustee. Thank you very much. Thanks

I welcome Prabha Yadav I think I understand the First Lady member of the trust.

Corpus augmentation with Rs. 40 lakhs from APSICON-2011 savings: As per the decision of Dr. Raja Sabapathy, the president of APSI-2011, part of the savings of APSICON2011 will be used for augmenting journal corpus. The interest generated will be added to the annual grant for the journal.

Printing and stationary Costs:

The estimated budget for the next year- 2022 will be Rs. 14 lakhs and an additional Rs.4 lakhs for the stationery and postage. There have large number of non-deliveries of print copies due to insufficient addresses. This has led to over 40% wastage pribt copies. With current funding of Rs. 7lakhs from the APSI, the entire burden to meet the shortfall of over 10lakhs rests on the revenue generated from advertisements. As discussed in the EC meeting, the decision was taken to print minimum copies to reduce the cost and introduce charges for print copies to the members so that the frequency of IJPS can be increased. The editor informed the GB about the problems and options of cost cutting measures. The President of APSI moved the proposal in the GBM to print minimum copies and charge for print copies to the members. The proposal was adopted after the motion was passed with 70-30 majority votes of GB.

Further to the ASPS- APSI MoU, associate editors of IJPS were recommended to the reviewers/editorial board members for PRS, PRS-Go.

Everyone favoured the holding of these 'online courses' and agreed a wide audience could be interested. In future, once the pandemic scare is over, it may be possible to have Hybrid courses where some participants are present physically and the rest participate 'online'.

The deliberations lasted over 70 min and the following decisions were taken.

- 1. The courses shall be conducted on a subscribed ZOOM platform for which the Treasurer shall make a Registration and payment on behalf of APSI. The subscription should be for one year and the platform will be available for unlimited time during the subscription period. This platform can then also be used for any other official APSI meetings also. The indicative cost of such a subscription was about \$15 per month, which all agreed was extremely reasonable.
- 2. Since the hosting cost was extremely low there was no immediate need to charge any Registration fee from the delegates. At least for the first year APSI could test waters by making the course free and then depending on the interest expressed by the participants a charge could be decided form the next year onwards. This could even be a

- once-a-year charge for all the courses for that year, and for new APSI members it could be made mandatory in the membership fee by adding a loading fee of Rs 1000 for that year.
- 3. With an estimated interest available being Rs 2.4 lakhs annually, there should be no immediate requirement for a major sponsor of these courses. However, small local sponsorship could be availed by the convenors to mitigate some incidental expenses. Such a sponsorship amount shall be paid directly to the Treasurer who will reimburse the convenors against actual invoices forwarded to him. This arrangement shall obviate the need to open individual 'course accounts' by the convenors and also do away with the system of APSI having a signed contract with the Convenors.
- 4. Large sponsors could be later invited to bolster support for these courses. The sponsorship levies can be worked out in a subsequent discussion. Similarly, the fee for the small local sponsorship also needs to be worked out. Henceforth, the Course Title shall drop the name 'Ethicon' and will now be known as;

APSI Accredited Course (Supported by APSICON 2005 & IPRAS 2009)

- 5. It was agreed that a structured curriculum for 3 years be drafted, focussed on PG training in all aspects, including lectures, case discussions, journal clubs and operative discussions on video.
- 6. Since this increase in scope of the courses envisaged tremendous insight and involvement in course designing and its conduct, it was suggested by Dr Khazanchi that a HOD of a Teaching Institution should be actively involved in this work. Hence, it was unanimously agreed that Dr Ramesh Sharma shall be appointed as the Co-Chairman of these courses.
- 7. Further, it was agreed to have these courses every month or every other month so that they impart comprehensive teaching, and become very attractive to postgraduate resident doctors
- **8.** and younger consultants. This format will also be not competing with other surfeit of webinars being held currently by other individuals or Societies.
- 9. If any APSI course date conflicts with the webinar of any other Society then APSI shall not change the announced date for its course.
- 10. Since it is difficult to sit before a computer for a long period of time it was agreed that these courses shall follow the weekend schedule as before but for only 4 hours each day (Saturday & Sunday) with a 30 min break after 2 hours. The course should be designed to complete in 8 hours schedule and if it is necessary it may be carried over to the next or any subsequent weekend, as may be feasible.
- 11. Dr Vinita was requested to prepare templates for graphic publicity and share in the next meeting.
- 12. Dr Vinita shall be hosting the first 'online module' in January / February 2021, as may be feasible, and on the same topic as assigned to her last year because the course content and the speakers are already planned.
- 13. Dr Khazanchi mentioned that APSI was shortly hiring a part time Secretary for its virtual office and she could assist in Registration for these courses, and handling all other correspondence, including sending the mailers.
- 14. It was decided that a registration link would be sent so that each delegate / faculty would register and receive an individual unique password. This would help us keep listing of those registering and would help increase our database for sending further program links.
- 15. Dr. Vinita was requested to procure the contact ids (email and phone numbers) of the resident groups in the country. This list shall complement the APSI membership mailing database.

Subject: Renaming of "Kilner award" as "Kilner Ramesh Chandra award" for the period of five years

Dear Dr. Vijay,

At the outset, I express heartfelt gratitude and thanks for considering my request to add the name of Dr. Ramesh Chandra with the pre-existing Kilner award in the award restructuring category group. I have noted as per your email that the EC of 2019 has already resolved to rename the award as Kilner Ramesh Chandra award for five years. I agree to augment the corpus from 1.13 lakh to 10 lakh.

However, I have reservations over the addition of 5 years clause with this renaming. In this regard, I wish to submit the following facts:

- 1. That the awards committee under the leadership of Prof. V. Bhattacharya did a commendable job in laying the guidelines and framework of pre-existing and new awards published in the minutes of GB 2018. Needless to say that these recommendations as have been stated by Prof. V. Bhattacharya himself have been discussed threadbare by EC and then presented elaborately to GB of 2018. Further on suggestions have also been received from Gurgaon EC of 2018. These recommendations are being followed in black and white from then on in all the subsequent APSI meetings.
- 2. That the awards committee had made it eloquently clear that no new award will be perpetual and there will be a time limit of 5-10 years for a new award.
- 3. That the recommendation clearly states in respect of the Kilner award as follows: "Augment corpus to ten lakhs. Can add another name to it"

There is no mention of a time limit in this recommendation.

- 4. That the request was made to add the name of Dr. Ramesh Chandra with the pre-existing Kilner award only after thoroughly studying the document and reading the conditions associated with this particular award.
- 5. That no clarification, amendment has been issued regarding time limit of the Kilner award all these years since the recommendations were published in 2018.
- 6. That it appears unfair to impose the time limit of 5 years when the already published, accepted and properly veted document of the award committee of APSI specifically does not mention any such clause in respect of the Kilner award.
- 7. That the imposition of 5 years time frame does not match with the recommendation of APSI's own award committee in respect of this award and hence is not a part of the guideline.

In light of above facts, I first would like to thank the APSI EC of 2019 to have taken the decision to rename the award as Kilner Ramesh Chandra award but would strongly request to drop the 5 year time limit on the ground that this particular clause does not exist in the original and the current document and guidelines of the award committee.

Hoping for a kind consideration of my request.

Starting new visiting professorships and National Travelling fellowships

New visiting professorships can be started in Microsurgery, Hand surgery, Plastic surgery, cosmetic surgery, cleft and craniofacial surgery etc. Similarly Visiting National Travelling

fellowships can be started in similar sub specialities. They can be named after an individual. The amount for professorship will be Rs. 1,50,000 and for national Travelling fellowship will be Rs. 1,00,000. The total amount of

Rs. 2,50,000 needs to be paid for one professorship and one national travelling fellowship by the person who intends to start these fellowships. So we can have 5 such sponsors each paying Rs. 2,50,000. The entire interest amount will be handed over to awardees. APSI will not earn anything out of this.

Sponsors name will be acknowledged as (supported by ---). The president APSI will have the authority to choose names of professors for each subspecialty and EC and GB will finalise the same every year.

Secretary informed that he has received an email from Dr Alok Sharma the proposal for instituting a 'Visiting Professorship in Plastic Surgery' in the name of Late Dr (Brig) Sandeep Mehrotra, on behalf of his wife, Lt Col (Mrs) Shraddha Mehrotra and children Ms Vidushi and Mr Vidur Mehrotra, who wish to sponsor the award as per the rules of APSI. May I request you to kindly put it up for consideration by the Executive of APSI.

The matter was discussed in Executive committee rules say The amount of corpus to be paid to APSI is Rs. 2.5 Lacs for duration of 5 Years. The Award will automatically be stopped after stipulated date. If the award instituting authorities want to continue the award they should send fresh proposal to EC a year in advance of stipulated date. The EC will then deliberate and present it to GB for approval. There will be agreement signed between APSI and award instituting authorities to this effect as decided by the EC. In case the award is discontinued after 10 years award instituting authorities cannot claim back the corpus donation. APSI will have full authority to utilize the corpus. JUDGMENT

- 1. WPSS No. 2090 of 2019 filed by the petitioner was disposed of with a liberty to petitioner to make representation to Director, AIIMS, Rishikesh and Director, AIIMS was required to decide the same by passing a speaking order within four weeks.
- 2. Mr. Rakesh Thapliyal, learned Senior Counsel for the opposite party submits that Director, AIIMS, Rishikesh has rejected petitioner's representation vide order dated 21. 11.2020.
- 3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the said order is not a speaking order, inasmuch as, the issues raised by the petitioner in his representation have not been considered at all.

4. Be that as it may, since the Director, AIIMS, Rishikesh has considered and rejected petitioner's representation by assigning some

2

reasons, therefore, this Court is of the considered opinion that this is not a case of willful disobedience for which opposite party can be proceeded against under provisions of Contempt of Courts Act.

5. Accordingly, the contempt petition is closed. Notice issued to the opposite party is hereby discharged. However, petitioner shall be at liberty to challenge the rejection order dated 21.11.2020 passed by Director, AIIMS, Rishikesh before the appropriate forum.

Secretary requested Dr Khazanchi to brief Dr Khazanchi said Aiims Rishikesh started Mch programme in craniofacial surgery under the chairmanship of dental department, this case was filed in High Court in Rishikesh ,we had lawyers who came from Bombay and there was a local lawyer also hired, Dr satish was coordinating the the progress of this case, unfortunately this case was dismissed in the first appearance because the court said that they will not interfere with what director Aiims is doing, but they asked the director Aiims to pass a a speaking order, to explain why what he had done, the director gave us the speaking order, we were not satisfied with that, and the previous lawyers had already withdrawn so with the help of some family lawyers , we went back to the court and court asked the Aiims director s to give a proper reply to our answers, so after some time reply came and the case was disposed, only positive thing we got out of the final disposal after his reply was, we were free to proceed and appeal against this course so that is where the situation stands now and we need direction,

so this was deliberated in the exco and what decided to file review petition. I am coming to that so now the situation is that t in 2019 one one candidate had joined for this course but subsequent to that there was no one else who took that course or actually they didn't even advertising so 2021 and the second development which we know is that the person under whose chairmanship this course was being started was not a full time faculty he was coming from another city he was coming spending maybe 2 or 3 days a week initially, that faculty member also has not entirely stop coming but nowadays, last we heard that he comes once in 3 months to be honest, we have no no idea about what his position is, and how often he is coming, these are just through some discreet enquiries. Our stay in this course rests on the fact that the dental council act says that the dental surgeons practice is limited to the jaws and the surrounding area and of course surrounding area cannot include cranium, the executive felt that it is only because of this case at least as of now the course stands suspended, we must go back and appeal against this order and maybe as one of our senior people pointed to keep our foot in the door to prevent them from closing it completely and maybe that will also with the faculty member who ran the course not being there full time, maybe they will not start this course so it will involve some expenses which maybe may be one to two lakh for filing the case, then anywhere maybe 20 to 30,000/- per appearance, but this includes only the fees for the for the lawyer who's going to file and if there is any senior advice is required that will be given through so that is the situation and the second thing that I would like to apprise you here is they have the dental council there is a pending bill which is called the dental council act is pending as a dental council bill, where they are trying to include cranium as part of their curriculum in this part of their field because, that is a modification of the dental council act that they are trying to propose so this was put in public domain for objections in the APSI has objected to that in very strong words and we also still don't know what the situation regarding this is and then the exco nominated Dr Manish Singhal to follow up, as to what may happen to this and whether we get that information know we don't know what at least there is no harm in trying as to what is what is happening, so that I will come back to whether we should go ahead and file the case against this Aiims Rishikesh course, exco deliberated on this, it was resolved that the review petition be filed and expenses be paid as we have proposed at this time so executive council passed it unanimously.
