President's Message Dr Ravi Mahajan, President –APSI



Dear APSI Members,

Greetings from the holy city of Amritsar.

As my tenure as APSI President is coming to an end, I was just going through my vision statement delivered at Bhubaneshwar before the election and analyzing whether I have been able to fulfil some of the promises made at the that time.

Main Agenda was to prevent encroachment by other specialties into our domain for which I had divided it into two heads.

- 1. Preventing unqualified and unauthorized people from doing plastic surgery procedures. Medico-legal cell of the association with active support of our immediate Past President Dr. R.K. Khazanchi has been fighting a court case vehemently and we have been able to stop an unauthorized craniofacial superspecialty degree course to be started by a national level institution. Our APSI Secretary Dr. Vijay Kumar with the support of Prof. Ramesh Sharma and other members have also been able to help NMC make proper guidelines preventing unauthorized people to do hair transplantation and other aesthetic procedures thus compromising the safety of patients at large.
- 2. The way to deal with competing specialties in certain areas lies in better advocacy for the specialty as well as improving our own professional skills so that we prove ourselves to be better than those from the competing

specialties. As part of the advocacy programme, this year Plastic Surgery Day was celebrated by the association at national level by organizing "APSI Sushruta Film Festival" in which we had 126 entries from all over the country. This programme celebrated over two days at AIIMS and Central Services Officers` Institute (CSOI) was hugely successful in reaching to the general public as well as higher echelons of power through national media and educating them about the complete spectrum of Plastic Surgery and its role in changing lives of the people. Public awareness programmes done in collaboration with Omnicuris, an online platform for education of doctors, was another attempt by the association in direction of strong advocacy for our specialty amongst general practitioners and other specialty doctors.

For improvement of professional skills of our younger colleagues we have started working in the direction of having APSI accredited short term fellowships in various subspecialties of Plastic Surgery. "Hand Holding Programme" is another initiative in this direction where younger colleagues will be hand held by the senior surgeons to

help them establish in the peripheral areas by visiting them for a few days and assisting them in various manners. I have made a personal donation of Rs. two lakhs for this purpose to carry out a pilot project for a period of two years. I am hopeful that this programme will go a long way in an enhancing the professional capabilities of young plastic surgeons.

- 3. Other initiatives taken during last one year include starting of APSI-PG Medical Education Programme and APSI Research Wing which will go a long way in improving the quality of teaching of post graduate students as well as developing research culture amongst the plastic surgeons as well as students.
- 4. Starting APSI video library is also on the anvil which will become a rich academic resource for all the members free of cost thus adding value to the membership.
- 5. I will leave you with two thoughts for the future:
  - We need to regularly improve our advocacy programme amongst the general

practitioners and other specialty doctors. For this the association needs to hire a professional agency who can do strong advocacy through various channels including social media etc. For this we have to look into generating more funds for the association through donations as well as having annual subscription, as is the norm with all the international associations. Regular availability of funds will also help in running the association in a more professional and efficient manner.

We must debate about starting the e-voting process which seems to be the demand of the day. We already have experimented the process during Covid times and have found it to be quite secure and free of any glitches. This will give a chance to every APSI members to exercise his / her democratic right to vote whether he / she is able to attend the conference or not.

I want to sincerely thank all the EC members, APSI Trust members and many others who have provided their wholehearted support to me and in fact credit for many of the initiatives taken during my tenure goes to them.

Last but not the least the organizing committee is all geared up to welcome you to Amritsar with an academic as well as cultural extravaganza. I request all of you to join in large numbers for this mega event which is happening after a period of three years.

# APSI organises Sushruta Film Festival

On 15 July, 2022, on the occasion of the 12th National Plastic Surgery Day, the APSI along with the Department of Plastic Surgery, AIIMS organised a Plastic Surgery Film Festival. This was envisioned as a platform to promote the best work by plastic surgeons in an easily understandable format for the public to

enhance the understanding of this speciality as well as to change the public perception about its various domains.

Around 120 short films of 3-7 minutes length were received from all over the country. They showed how plastic surgery has miraculously affected patients' lives. They were all films showing Plastic Surgery's truly remarkable ability to turn disfigured to natural and natural to beautiful.

They were judged by a jury of experts from the Film and Television Institute of India and the best of these films were screened at AIIMS, New Delhi.

The Hon'ble Union Minister of State for the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Dr. Bharti Pravin Pawar was invited as the chief guest. She commended the efforts made by the APSI and reiterated the commitment of the Government under the leadership of Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji towards securing the health of the people of India.

Dr. Ravi Mahajan, the president of the APSI emphasised the role of a plastic surgeon in trauma care and appealed to the Ministry to ensure a team of Plastic surgeons in all trauma centres of the nation as has been demonstrated at AIIMS Delhi.

Dr. Randeep Guleria, the Director of AIIMS also congratulated the fraternity for the national plastic surgery day.

Dr. Subrata Sinha, the Dean (Academics) and the acting Director of AIIMS, New Delhi lauded the role of plastic surgery department of AIIMS in providing functionality and dignity to the victims of Acid Attacks, major trauma, Burn, Leprosy and Transgender care.

Dr. Vijay Kumar, APSI Secretary briefed the media about the availability of Plastic surgery services across India and the huge number of cases being performed by the fraternity on a daily basis

Dr. Maneesh Singhal, the HOD of Plastic, Reconstructive and Burns Surgery at AIIMS, New Delhi mentioned how Plastic Surgery is India's gift to the world with the great sage Sushruta, being the father of Plastic Surgery.





The best movie was adjudged to be "Conquering Disability by Plastic Surgery" by Dr. Parag Sahasrabudhe from Pune, a story of a young teenager, with bone cancer in his leg. He had been advised amputation, but Plastic surgery helped him to rebuild his life, dream big, do the unbelievable and achieve the extraordinary.

The second-best movie was "From Despair to Hope" by Dr. Subramania Iyer from Kerala. It tells the wonderful story of how Manu, who had lost both his hands in a train accident, was given a new hope, when he was

offered a hand transplantation. Now, he has recovered well and is working as a transplant counsellor in the same hospital.

The third prize went to Kathrivel, a movie by Dr. S. Raja Sabhapathy, an emotional story of how debilitating post burn contractures can be and how plastic surgery can restore the dignity of life for such a patient.

Three more Special Awards were also given.

"Hands that Help" a movie By Dr. Sunil Gaba from Chandigarh about reattachment of an amputated hand of Inspector Harjeet Singh who was attacked while on duty.

"Imperfectly Perfect", a movie by Dr. Shivangi Saha from Delhi, showed the brutality of acid attacks and the grit and determination of the victims as they pick themselves back up and fight back for a normal life.

"Empowering Children through Microtia Surgery" by Dr. Parag Telang from Mumbai, was about the difficult life of kids born without ears and how a plastic surgeon can help restore their appearance.


Vote of thanks given by Dr Sujata Sarabahi, Exco member APSI.







#### THE GOLDEN TEMPLE

The Golden Temple (also known as the Harmandir Sahib) is a gurdwara located in the city of Amritsar, Punjab, India. It is the preeminent spiritual site of Sikhism.

The gurdwara is built around a man-made pool (sarovar) that was completed by the fourth Sikh Guru, Guru Ram Das, in 1577. In 1604, Guru Arjan placed a copy of the Adi Granth in Harmandir Sahib. The Gurdwara was repeatedly rebuilt by the Sikhs after it became a target of persecution and was destroyed several times by the Mughal and invading Afghan armies. Maharaja Ranjit Singh, after founding the Sikh Empire, rebuilt it in marble and copper in 1809 and overlaid the sanctum with Gold foil in 1830. This has led to the name the Golden Temple.

#### **JALLIANWALA BAGH**

Jallianwala Bagh is a historic garden and 'memorial of national importance' close to the Golden Temple complex in Amritsar, Punjab, India, preserved in the memory of those wounded and killed in the Jallianwala Bagh Massacre that occurred on the site on the festival of Baisakhi, 13 April 1919. The 7-acre site houses a museum, gallery and several memorial structures. It is managed by the Jallianwala Bagh National Memorial Trust. It was renovated between 2019 and 2021.





#### **PARTITION MUSEUM**

The Partition Museum is a public museum located in the town hall in Amritsar, India. The museum aims to become the central repository of stories, materials, and documents related to the post-partition riots that followed the division of British India into two independent countries: India and Pakistan. The museum was inaugurated on 25 August 2017.

In 1947, British India was divided into India and Pakistan. The partition lines, drawn on a map by the British lawyer Cyril Radcliffe, divided the states of Punjab into West Punjab and East Punjab on the basis of religion. As a result, millions of people found themselves on the wrong side of the border overnight.

#### **WAGAH BORDER**

The lowering of the flags ceremony at the Attari-Wagah border is a daily military practice that the security forces of India (Border Security Force, BSF) and Pakistan (Pakistan Rangers) have jointly followed since 1959. The drill is characterized by elaborate and rapid dance-like manoeuvres and raising legs as high as possible, which have been described as "colourful". It is alternatively a symbol of the two countries' rivalry, as well as brotherhood and cooperation between the two nations.



At the international border between India and Pakistan, the pomp and pageantry of the Beating Retreat and the Change of Guard occur within the handshaking distance of the Indian and Pakistani forces. Wagah, an army outpost on the India-Pakistan border between Amritsar and Lahore, is an elaborate complex of buildings, roads and barriers on both sides.



#### **GOBINDGARH FORT**

Gobindgarh Fort is a historic military fort located in the center of the city of Amritsar in the Indian state of Punjab. The Fort was until recently occupied by the army but was opened to the public from 10 February 2017. Today the fort is being developed as a museum and theme park, as a repository of Punjab's history. Popularly known as the Bhangian da Killa (fort of the Bhangis) after its 18th century founder belonging to Bhangi Misl of Dhillon Jats rulers. Sandhawalia Jat ruler Maharaja Ranjit Singh renamed it in the early 19th century after the 10th Sikh guru, Guru Gobind Singh.





It have always been felt that after completing your training when you go out in the field and you are on your own, if someone is there to hold your hand and guide you not only about the professional aspects but practical aspects of establishing yourself the specialty, can he really helpful. Keeping this in mind, Dr. Ravi Mahajan had proposed "Holding Hands" as a

pilot project for a period of two years for the benefit of younger colleagues.

The concept rests on the idea of the Mentor visiting the mentee to impart one to one hands on mentoring for assessing the patients, evaluating results, assisting in surgeries and offering suggestions about infrastructure, inventory and advocacy thus offering a concentrated opportunity to upgrade the skills of the Mentee.

Four mentors will be selected every year from amongst the eligible applicants. There will be a pool of mentors available for the mentors to select from whom they want to visit.

Initial funding of Rs. 200,000/- has been provided by Dr. Ravi Mahajan as a personal donation to APSI Trust for this pilot project.

#### **Process:**

APSI will create a list of available Mentors fulfilling following criteria:

- 1. Minimum 10 years of clinical experience after M. Ch. (Plastic Surgery) or equivalents thereof.
- 2. APSI Member for at least 10 years.
- 3. A committee comprising of the President, the Vice President, Hon. Secretary, one of the Trustees and myself will select the Mentors from among the applicants or by direct recommendation.

APSI will invite applications from 4 mentees each year. The Mentee must fulfil following criteria:

- 1. M. Ch. (Plastic Surgery) or equivalents thereof.
- 2. APSI Member with active membership.
- 3. The mentee should specify the desired areas of interest in which he/she expects the Mentor to help.

#### **Matching / Selection:**

The selected mentee should approach one of the mentors out of the pool depending upon his need and then they can decide upon the dates and the programme which should have operative session, lecture for local doctors and preferably an interaction with the media to create awareness amongst the public about the importance of plastic surgery as a specialty.

The mentee should prepare a list of expected surgeries to be performed and also any of the academic commitment expected from the mentor.

Once the programme is finalised it should be forwarded to the Hon. Secretary who will seek approval from the head of Holding Hands programme\* and organise funding from the APSI Trust.

\* Dr. Ravi Mahajan will head the Committee for a period of two years which is the duration of this pilot project. After the expiry of two years, decision regarding the continuation of the project can be taken by the EC in consultation with the Trustee depending upon the success of pilot project and availability of further funding.

The Mentee should coordinate with the proposed Mentor and plan the logistics of stay and travel.

#### **Expenses:**

APSI will pay the Mentor a sum of maximum Rs. 25,000/- towards cost of travel & other logistics. Local hospitality should be taken care of by the mentee as per mutual understanding and in keeping with the tradition of Indian hospitality.

#### **Terms and conditions:**

• Any surgery performed by the Mentor should be in the capacity of an assistant to the mentee.

- The mentee will ensue full legal compliance required for the mentor participating in any clinical activity in the given setup.
- APSI explicitly indemnifies itself from any complications / mishaps that may happen at the time of / after the operative procedure in which the mentor participates.
- The mentee will have to sign a written declaration that the place of surgery has all the statutory and legal permissions in effect at the time of undertaking the surgical procedure.
- The mentor will carry this declaration form with him/her and will ensure to get it signed prior to starting any activity during the visit.
- The mentor will not attend any conference / workshop / CME during his/her mentoring visit. The mentor's visit should not be in continuity with any workshop / CME / conference, neither before nor after.
- At the end of the working hours, the expertise of the Mentor may be utilized for a lecture or a seminar.




