

Sub: **Comments Regarding Live Surgical Broadcasts (LSBs) in terms of the Public Notice.**

I am representing on behalf of the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India (APSI) as its current President. Our association represents all active members of Indian Plastic Surgery Community. Over 1800 Plastic surgeons are members of our association.

We appreciate NMC for its efforts to seek comments from the stakeholders to evaluate the issue of live surgeries broadcast by the private hospitals in the country.

We would like to put forward the following response to the pertinent questions raised by the Ethical Committee of the National Medical Commission (NMC):

1) **Live Operative Workshop:** The primary aim of any live surgical demonstration is to train surgeons at different levels of competency. These surgeries are performed by highly experienced surgeons with utmost dexterity and skill. While performing live operative surgeries they are able to share their valuable experience and insight with the audience predominantly practising surgeons and post graduate students.

Can Edited Videos replace Live Surgery?

No. In edited videos it is easily possible for surgeons to do away with problem situations, difficult steps and are biased to show only successful sequences. In live

surgery people are watching every step and since only capable surgeons are doing the extent of learning is unimaginable.

Has live surgery helped Indian students?

1) India now boasts of having many centres capable of performing complex surgeries for patients with Brachial plexus injury. In fact this specialty itself took up in India at the time of forming the society by live surgical demonstrations by the French Surgeon Christophe Oberlin and Italian Surgeon Pierre Raimondi. It opened the eyes of many surgeons about the possibilities.

2) It was a live surgical workshop where in Prof David Chuang from Taiwan demonstrated a complex free functioning muscle transfer (complex microsurgery procedure) at Ganga Ram Hospital, New Delhi which made many surgeons see that and start doing it .

3) It was the international wrist surgery workshop held in Ganga Hospital in 2011 where in pioneers in wrist surgery Dr. Andrew Weiland, Dr. Richard Gilberman and Dr. Martin Boyer (all 3 had been Presidents of the American Society for Surgery of the Hand (ASSH)). So we have benefited a lot from live surgical workshops.

2) It is solely for educational purpose and it is carried out as a standalone workshop or as a part of the main conference. The workshop always attracts more participants as they find it very useful for their day to day practise. These provide maximum benefit to the practicing surgeons as they are shown what is current standard practice of care for a particular problem. The workshop are always focused one particular disease or modality of treatment. For example: Lymphedema workshop highlights management of Lymphedema, Rhinoplasty workshops focuses on the surgery of the nose. There is multi-disciplinary approach which is also highlighted by the presence of experts from various sub-specialities treating a similar spectrum of patients.

3) Do Private institutions only do live surgery?

The answer is no. A large number of government institutions also do live surgery workshops. AIIMS do live surgical workshops. Recently the government of Tamil Nadu has encourage performance of live surgical workshops to teach the surgeons of the government institutions on procedures in Diabetic Foot to help prevent amputations. The government has realised the urgent need for capacity building and has advised that live surgical workshops are the best way to make this happen.

4) **Industry partnership and participation:** it is an important part of these workshops as there are expenses involved in the form of implants, prosthesis, microsurgical sutures and equipments . The patient who gets these expensive treatment are the ones who cannot afford it otherwise. The indications for treatment are clearly outlined and carried out by experts in the field. The point that poor patients are like guinea pigs is not true. Many affordable and relatives of doctors and hospital staff also undergo treatment during these workshops based on the problem they have and the nature of the workshop. All Government medical colleges

and institutes of national importance like AIIMS already operate on poor patients free of cost. Hence the point of patients' affordability is not an issue.

At the present state of affairs, industry people are as cautious as surgeons and as committed as surgical fraternity to see that there are no complications or untoward instances during surgery when housing their products. No industry is willing to sacrifice their name and reputation by allowing inexperienced surgeons or any inappropriate operating theatre circumstances. Industry supports only good surgeons, capable surgeons and reputed hospitals. In fact they also have a lot of loss if there by any complications and do not take the risk.

5) **Are poor people exploited?**

In India as per the current state of affairs, no Patient irrespective of social status, will accept a complication or compromised outcomes. There is improve awareness .

Secondly many procedures that are usually demonstrated during the workshop are expensive and when done during the conference workshops are done free to the patients. In fact, we have so much enquiries from people if they could be included in conferences. This has been our frequent experience wherein in complex deformities of the hand or whom one side has done through conferences, the patients and parents keep asking us for the other side also to be done through a conference.

6) **Distraction and risk to the patient during Surgery:** During the live operative workshop a point has been raised regarding distraction to the operating surgeon and intraoperative risk to the patient on table. During all operations carried out in major teaching institute both in the public sector (M.Ch) and private sector (DNB) senior operating surgeons are surrounded by Post Graduates and Trainees who keep asking questions and doubts during the steps of the procedure. Answering all the doubts of trainees and fellows by the senior surgeon is a norm. Distraction during live surgery is not an issue as there are moderators who are senior enough and are able to judge the steps and ask the pertinent questions only during the stage where the operating surgeon is able to answer comfortably. These moderators are surgeons who are equally qualified and have been faculty for live surgery themselves many times.

Therefore in our experience distractions are unlikely because the persons who are operating are extremely experienced and patients are unlikely to suffer. Hundreds of live surgery cases have been done and people may point out one or two isolated examples of complications and could be highlighting it. We honestly submit the percentage of complications happen during the live surgery workshop, it will be same like that of a regular surgery.

7) **Role of Foreign faculty:** International expert surgeons are always not needed in all live surgery workshops but they are present in workshops which show case cutting edge technology and newer techniques which are at its nascent phase in India. Many surgeries which are carried out in the US and UK take around 5 to 10 years to become routine and norm in India. Hence by inviting these experienced foreign faculty to operate in live surgery workshops is able to bring about change in the practice. Many Indian surgeons also travel abroad and carryout similar surgeries in neighbouring countries, South-east Asia and Africa. In all these countries the local organizer is able to get a temporary license for the Indian Surgeons. This hugely benefits lot of trainees who otherwise cannot travel to India.

8) Live Surgical Workshops happen not just in India: Many developed countries like Singapore, Japan, Taiwan, Malaysia, USA and UK and Gulf Countries also have regular live surgery workshops which have huge participation from India. A point to note here is the amount of foreign exchange which Indian Surgeons spend in travelling abroad and attending the live workshops can easily be reduced by Indian centres hosting them by inviting the faculty and having them operate in our workshops in India. The infrastructure currently available in most of our centres are at par to many international centres. This will hugely benefit the doctors and reduced the drain of foreign exchange abroad.

Live surgery workshops can also be streamed online where the world is our stage. It may have its issues as in any system. The need of the hour is to lay guidelines and get on to surgery and not to totally abolish the established systems.

9) **Benefit to the Surgical Fraternity:** The live surgery workshops not only benefits the audience watching them in the auditorium or online, but also immensely helps the local participating team of doctors, nurses, OT technicians and trainees who participate, scrub along and interact with the expert faculty. As doctor's we have the luxury to travel and watch procedures and new techniques when we are visiting or doing a short fellowship at a centre of excellence abroad. But our nurses and support staff like physiotherapist never get this unique opportunity. Hence when the foreign faculty comes for live workshop, everyone benefits. An example is when we have live workshops for difficult wrist problems the faculty is able to interact with the entire operating team, the nurses and technicians who make the pre and post op splints. The participation from all stakeholders inside and outside the operating rooms makes these live workshop extremely beneficial to everyone.

10) **Clear safety guidelines:** Most Live Workshops have safety protocol already in place, but it can be more streamlined so that it can be implemented and followed by all centres and societies who are carrying out regular live workshops. Standard Operating protocols are used for every procedure. Highly complicated and difficult operations are seldom shown live. The whole idea of these workshop is to make all the participating surgeons carry-out these procedures in their respective centres.

11) Most international doctors get a temporary license, the process of getting one as of now is a bit tedious as their degree certificates are in foreign language and it needs to be notarised by a lawyer in their country and sent for temporary licensing. The time lag between applying for a temporary license takes few months which can be easily streamlined.

12) Finally the recording of the entire workshop can be viewed multiple times by the trainees and the fellows. With NMC now insisting on competency based medical education (CBME) even surgical procedure skills, live surgical demonstration have become even more relevant offering point by point clarification of doubts of learners in real time ensuring experiential learning.

The grievance of the petitioner:

The petitioner has given generalised comments without stating any specific instance. We would humbly request the NMC not to fall prey into this petition. If they could come up with specific instances it will help us to take necessary steps and lay guidelines. We as a national society are equally concerned in maintaining highest standards in conducting a live operating worksop.

Overall it is our belief that a well conducted live workshop keeping patient safety at its core and following clear guidelines will hugely benefit the participants, societies and our

country as whole. We look forward to standard guidelines which can further streamline the conduct of these workshops. We as a society are ready to partner with NMC to study the impact and effectiveness of the live surgical workshops.

Riding on the new wave of Indian Pride and Self-respect for a specialty like ours which originated from India (Sushruta- Indian Rhinoplasty), live surgical demonstration to the entire world (Vasudeva Kudumbam) must be encouraged to showcase our technical prowess, volume of work and clinical decision making skills.

Live Operative Workshops

- The primary aim of any live surgical demonstration is to TRAIN surgeons at different levels of competency (predominantly practicing surgeons and post graduate students).
- It is solely for EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES and it is carried out as a standalone workshop or as a part of the main conference.
- Industry partnership and participation is important part of these workshops as there are expenses involved in the form of implants, prosthesis, microsurgical sutures and materials.

- Distraction and risk to the patient during Surgery
 - In routine practice operations carried out in major teaching institutes (public and private sector) have surgeons who are surrounded by Post Graduates and Trainees who keep asking questions during the steps of the procedure.
 - There are **MODERATORS** who are senior enough and are able to judge the steps and ask the pertinent questions only during the stage where the operating surgeon is able to answer comfortably.
 - The indications for treatment are clearly outlined and carried out by experts in the field (poor patients are NOT like guinea pigs).
- Clear safety guidelines
 - Safety protocol already in place
 - Standard Operating protocols are used for every procedure.
 - Highly complicated and difficult operations are seldom shown live.

- Benefit to the Surgical Fraternity
 - immensely helps the local participating team of doctors, nurses, OT technicians and trainees who participate and scrub along with them.
- Educational purpose
 - the recording of the entire workshop can be viewed multiple times by the trainees and the fellows.
 - The steps demonstrated brings about valuable discussion regarding each and every step and how to handle the intraoperative variations in anatomy and pathology of the involved case.
 - benefit to the practicing surgeons as they are shown what is the current standard practice of care for a particular problem.
- Role of Foreign faculty
 - workshops which showcase cutting edge technology and newer techniques which are at its nascent phase in India.
 - Many surgeries which are carried out in the US and UK take around 5 to 10 years to become routine and norm in India.
 - Most international doctors get a temporary license.



Secretary presented the Summary of APSI Case in Uttarakhand HC*

HC of Uttarakhand passed order in Aug 2020 asking AIIMS Rishikesh to pass a Speaking Order (reasoned response) as per the Queries raised by APSI.

This order was received only in Nov 2020, and was found to be evasive, and replying to only one out of 20 queries raised. Hence a contempt of Court Petition was filed in March 2021, which was admitted, thanks to which AIIMS replied in August 2021 with few more details.

Following this, the HC closed the Contempt case, and gave APSI the liberty to challenge the Rejection by AIIMS in an order on 16.9.2021.

This second Petition was filed on February and argued on 16th by Mr. Siddharth Luthra. It was admitted and notice issued to the Respondents including AIIMS Rishikesh, MCI (NMC), DCI, DGHS, Health Ministry. Petition was admitted as WPMS/0000272-2022

Current Status: waiting to be listed for Final Hearing

Greetings to all of you from the city of Golden Temple Amritsar.

On behalf of the organising committee of APSICON 2022, I am delighted to share with all of you that Amritsar APSICON has been able to make a landmark savings of Rs.16067009.30(as per bank balance on 20/12/2023 with no other expected receivables or payables).

I'll be presenting a cheque of Rs 1.6 Cr in favour of APSI during EC meeting at Indore. As suggested by our CA we are not closing the account as of now but would be doing the same before the end of this financial year and rest of the money will also be transferred to the APSI account. A sum of Rs. ten lakh plus is also likely to accrue to APSI on account of TDS deducted at source by the sponsors thus further adding to the actual savings of the APSICON Amritsar by at least ten lakhs.

Respected Sir

I am writing to urgently seek your support against the severe harassment and fraudulent practices we have endured at the hands of Inmode. This company has exploited its resources to put us through an ordeal that no doctor should face.

In response to these illegal actions, we lodged a police complaint and registered an FIR eight months ago (**attachment 1 copy of police complaint and FIR**). However, there has been a disturbing lack of progress in the investigation. The local police, citing pressure from higher authorities, have advised us to distance ourselves from the case, further compounding our frustration and sense of injustice. The Higher Police Official has explicitly mentioned receiving directives to close the investigation prematurely, suggesting undue influence from the multinational company.

In November 2021, we were excited young doctors, eagerly taking demos for multiple machines before our center was even built. Among various companies, Inmode stood out because their Managing Director visited us at home, assuring us of his direct support and promising significant benefits if we chose their machines. He convinced us to buy three machines, including the Evolvex, despite our initial hesitation. He promised it would be the first installation and that he would market it heavily for us, even bringing celebrities to our center and international training tour.

On the evening of his visit, he insisted on an advance payment of one lakh rupees, which we reluctantly provided. Subsequently, we received a quotation and paid 15% of the total amount, roughly 15.75 lakh rupees, by 4th December 2021 (**Attachment 2 Bank Receipt of Money of 53.25 Lakh**). As the center's construction progressed, we became busy with various purchases and the challenges of setting up a hospital.

By June and July, almost 3-4 months before installation We repeatedly requested the removal of Evolvex from the quotation and asked for a revised quotation to be sent to IndusInd Bank's Rahul in Jaipur. However, the Managing Director stopped communicating with us, causing significant concern since we had already paid a substantial amount (**Attachment 3 Indian Evidence Act Certified What's App Communication with Director Sameer wadhera**).

Further discrepancies appeared in the invoice and loan documents. There was no clear contractual agreement on how the remaining 50 lakh rupees were to be paid, raising questions about the seriousness of the transaction (**Attachment 4 Bajaj loan Related Documents & Invoice**). The Managing Director could easily manipulate the invoice values, as seen when he adjusted the amount from one crore five lakh rupees to one crore four lakh rupees after receiving a one lakh rupee payment. Sameer colluded with a contracted Sunil Panda Bajaj finance agent in Mumbai, inflating the cost of a machine from its actual price of 22-23 lakh INR to 1.04 crore INR. The loan form falsely indicated this inflated price, mentioning only one serial number. This fraudulent documentation made the machine appear 5 to 6 times more expensive than its true value, a deliberate modification intended to deceive during the loan processing.

The entire ordeal, including running to lawyers, police stations, and courts, has been exhausting and frustrating. His tactics have been to drain us into submission through endless delays and legal maneuvers.

The lack of clear payment terms, the manipulation of invoices, and the fraudulent loan process all point to a

Dear President Sir, Secretary Sir and all,

As you are aware, during the years 2021-22-23, the EC of the APSI undertook the "Do your Homework" initiative. It was a yearlong initiative. With contributions from friends and colleagues across India, Hon. Secretary Sir had sent weekly advocacy images to all members of the APSI and the members had shared the images across various social media platforms.

My humble suggestion is to initiate a similar yearlong advocacy program "Educate/enlighten the doctors". It would consist of activities to educate and enlighten the medical students/colleagues of other specialties regarding the spectrum of work we do as plastic surgeons.

In our 28 states and 8 union territories, we have around 800 districts. During the next one year, we can have one advocacy lecture in each of the 800 districts with emphasis on tier 3-4 cities. We have adequate strength and distribution in the APSI to cover 800 districts; at least most of them! Local plastic surgeons can take the advocacy lectures under the aegis of the Association of Plastic surgeons of India. Places where there are no plastic surgeons, plastic surgeons can visit from adjoining areas. The advocacy lecture can be taken in medical colleges to address the medical students/interns. Places, where there are no medical colleges, IMA members can be targeted. As a token of appreciation, APSI can give certificates of appreciation to the contributing members after the year.

With contributions from colleagues across India, we already have the presentation ready which can be used if felt necessary.

We can invite the state presidents/volunteers to identify Plastic surgeons in each of the districts. The success of the initiative would depend on the active participation of all the members.

Benefits would be:

1. Advocacy of the speciality across India.
2. Benefit of the advocacy to the local plastic surgeons.

Activities can be planned to be distributed through - out the year across India. Google form can be used to record and maintain data.

Once districts are covered, in the next step we can consider the talukas.

In my humble opinion, it would be a very useful activity undertaken by the APSI with active involvement of the members across India. If the suggestion is felt appropriate, the EC can possibly deliberate on it in the forthcoming EC/GB meet at Coimbatore.

If considered appropriate, I would be happy to assist in any way deemed necessary by the EC for this advocacy initiative.

I am writing on behalf of Bihar Jharkhand Plastic Surgeons Association (BJPSA, Registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860 with registration no. S000289 dated 07.11.2022) as Secretary of the association in context with the augmentation of corpus for Dr R N Sinha award money as suggested by Dr. Mukund Thatte sir in APSI MID TERM EXCO meeting on 6th April 2024 at Ooty. An Executive Committee meeting of BJPSA was held on 24th August 2024 and this matter was deliberated at length that Dr R N Sinha memorial award money given by APSI for the best paper in IJPS is only around 2,000/- and APSI suggested for its augmentation by the state society. On this matter, the ex-HOD of the Plastic Surgery department at Patna Medical College and a very senior plastic surgeon, Dr P K Verma told the history of the start of the Dr R N Sinha award.

History: In the years 1987-88, Dr. P K Verma requested the students of the Late Dr. R N Sinha, one of the pioneers of plastic surgery in India and the founder HOD of the Plastic Surgery department at Patna Medical College to contribute to the corpus building. The then APSI President, Dr J. R. Jaju also contributed making the entire corpus to 12,500/- and started the award in the name of Dr. R N Sinha for the best paper in the APSI journal in 1989-90.

The BJPSA EXCO decided that the total corpus can be made up to one lakh (1,00,000/-) and asked for the confirmation of the amount of the current corpus with APSI. Once the current amount of corpus is confirmed from APSI, the remaining amount will be provided from the BJPSA account to make the corpus with a gross total of one lakh. The state society executives expressed their feelings that it is a prestigious award in the name of the Late Dr R N Sinha and must be augmented by the society as a gesture of gratitude towards him.

So, I am putting in 2 requests on behalf of the Bihar Jharkhand Plastic Surgeons Association:

1. The history of Dr R N Sinha award needs to be corrected on the APSI website which currently mentions the name of Dr. J K Sinha. In reality, it was the efforts of Dr. P K Verma (for collection) and APSI Past President, the Late Dr. J. R. Jaju (for monetary

help and the start of the award).

2. APSI to inform the current amount of corpus so the state society can contribute the remaining money to make the total corpus of one lakh.




